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### UNICEF INTEGRATED FLOOD RESPONSE PAKISTAN

Baluchistan, the largest province of Pakistan, faces a multifaceted challenge of undernutrition exacerbated by poverty. Recent floods in 2022 and heavy rainfall in April 2023 have worsened the plight of Baluchistan's vulnerable populations, resulting in loss of life, infrastructure damage, and disruptions in essential services. Children, in particular, are at high risk of malnutrition, with acute cases worsened by factors such as inadequate nutrition, sanitation, and food price inflation.

In response to these critical conditions, our project intervention focuses on increasing access to life-saving nutrition services in flood-affected areas of Districts Jaffarabad, Naseerabad, Sohbatpur, Quetta, Dera Bugti, Killa Saifullah, Zhob, and Loralai. Through static and mobile outpatient therapeutic programs and nutrition outreach initiatives, we aim to address the immediate needs of the affected communities.

### **BNP BALUCHISTANI**

Pakistan's alarming rates of malnutrition signal an ongoing child nutrition crisis. To combat stunting during the critical first 1,000 days of a child's life, BISP has introduced a Conditional Cash Transfer initiative. Pregnant and lactating women (PLW) and children under 2 years from BISP beneficiary families will receive additional cash assistance, contingent upon attending health checks, awareness sessions, and adhering to nutritional guidelines. Moreover, BISP has expanded beneficiary eligibility by increasing the PMT Score from 32 to 60, benefiting almost 90% of eligible females. Plans are underway to engage community resource persons (CRPs) to

extend program coverage further.

#### **Monthly recap**

In February 2024, efforts focused on transitioning UCD beneficiaries to the GUC program, addressing inactive beneficiaries, and ensuring compliance with program criteria. Despite challenges, progress was made in achieving comprehensive coverage under the GUC scheme, demonstrating our commitment to inclusivity and equity.



#### **Beneficiaries assisted**

### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MATERNAL & NEWBORN NUTRITION PROGRAM REPORT (MNHN)



Throughout February, our focus remained on proactive engagement and diligent monitoring within the healthcare sector. Notably, visits to Kangaroo Mother Care (KMC) facilities were conducted to ensure the delivery of quality care and adherence to protocols. Strategic meetings with key stakeholders furthered our organizational objectives.

Productive discussions were held with the Medical Superintendent and Directors to streamline operations and address staffing requirements effectively. This demonstrated our commitment to operational efficiency and staff welfare.

Initiatives spearheaded by MNHN (Maternal and Neonatal Health Network) across various districts underscored our unwavering commitment to maternal and neonatal health. Highlights included monthly Progress Review Meetings, comprehensive Kangaroo Mother Care training sessions, and active engagement in multiple regions.

Proactive involvement in Khairpur, Lodhran, Swabi, Jamshoro, and Ziarat showcased a range of activities, including successful seminars, intern inductions, training sessions, and KMC Monitoring visits. February emphasized dynamic program implementation, collaborative efforts, and tangible achievements, signifying significant progress in enhancing maternal and child health services.

### **BNP SINDH**

In February 2023 and 2024, our teams in Sanghar, Umerkot, Mirpurkhas, NSF, SBA, Hyderabad, Matiari, Jacobabad, Kashmore Qambar, Tando Allayar, Karachi West, Karachi Central, Karachi Malir, Karachi South, Shikarpur, and Tharparkar focused on achieving targets and conducting follow-ups. In 2024, we achieved significant milestones with 55% coverage for Pregnant and Lactating Women (PBW) and 22% coverage for children. The SF-BNP team distributed specialized nutritious food (SNF) to 8,018 beneficiaries. Despite challenges, our teams performed exceptionally well, showcasing remarkable dedication and efficiency.

### **BNP PUNJAB**

Shifa Foundation, in partnership with WFP, IRMNCH & BISP, is implementing the Benazir Nashonuma Program across 13 districts of Punjab.

The program aims to prevent stunting through a 1000-days approach, targeting mothers and children already registered with BISP. Specialized nutritious food is provided to the most vulnerable members of the community.

#### Monthly recap:

In February, the Provincial Manager held a virtual meeting with DPCs to discuss outreach activities, enhancing enrollments, and beneficiary follow-ups. Additionally, the WFP Provincial team conducted a one-day refresher session in Gujranwala for district project coordinators on reporting and monitoring project activities.

During the month, the Provincial Manager also visited the Facility Center DHQ Rawalpindi (Nashonuma Center) to monitor project activities and provide guidance to FC staff on revised SAM component guidelines.
